#### **Artists Biographies:**

#### **Arianne Pollet-Brannen - Costumes**

A recent graduate of NSCAD University, Arianne's exploration of the fashioned body incorporates processes of deconstruction and reconstruction. Typically discarded leather footwear is taken apart to be reconfigured as clothing. Other sculptural constructions involve the recycling of rejected parts of garments. These 'rejects' are collaged and reconstructed with embroidery and acrylic paint to create unorthodox wearable sculpture.

## **Bob Chaisson - Set Design**

The reverend Bob Chaisson has been a long standing member of the Halifax Art Department. He continues to amass large collections of junk and prides himself on his small pack of killer Chihuahuas.

#### Janice Jackson – Vonda de Ville

Janice Jackson is one of Canada's foremost interpreters of contemporary vocal repertoire. She has performed in modern music festivals and concert halls around the world, sung over 170 world premieres of new works (many written specifically for her), appeared as a guest artist with numerous modern music ensembles the world over and is the Artistic Director of Vocalypse Productions.
